States must complete implementation of the new provisions which directly relate to the cer-tification of households by Nov. 1, 1974, for all new applications and any subsequent applica-tions, and by March 1, 1975 for all other households.

Public comments were invit-ed when the regulations were published in proposed form in the Federal Register on Jan. 28. FNS received over 2,000 comments which were consid-
