

On New Jail

Is Main Item

There are many items on the agenda for the meeting of the Board of Commissioners next Monday evening, including the major item, the public hearing on the sale of bonds to construct a

The Commissioners are expected to authorize \$750,000 worth of bond anticipation notes to pay final costs on the three schools now being constructed. Commission Chairman Bill Ives said he hopes his fellow Commissioners will agree to sell bond anticipation notes rather than bonds at this time, because the interest rate is so high.

The best advice from bond experts in New York persuaded Mr. Ives that interest rates should drop in 1975 and that would be a more favorable time to market long-term bonds.

County Attorney Bill White will have the final lease with the State Road Department to be approved for the landfill. Mr. White is also expected to have the final agreement with the Rosman Rescue Squad to operate a county-owned ambulance in the upper end of the county.

An ordinance regulating the use of the "green boxes" located around the county will be offered. The proposed ordinance reads as follows:
