Salad Punch

Mr. and Mrs. Norman Koppen of Miami, Florida, have announced the engagement of their daughter, Elizabeth Louise and David Eugene Clavier.



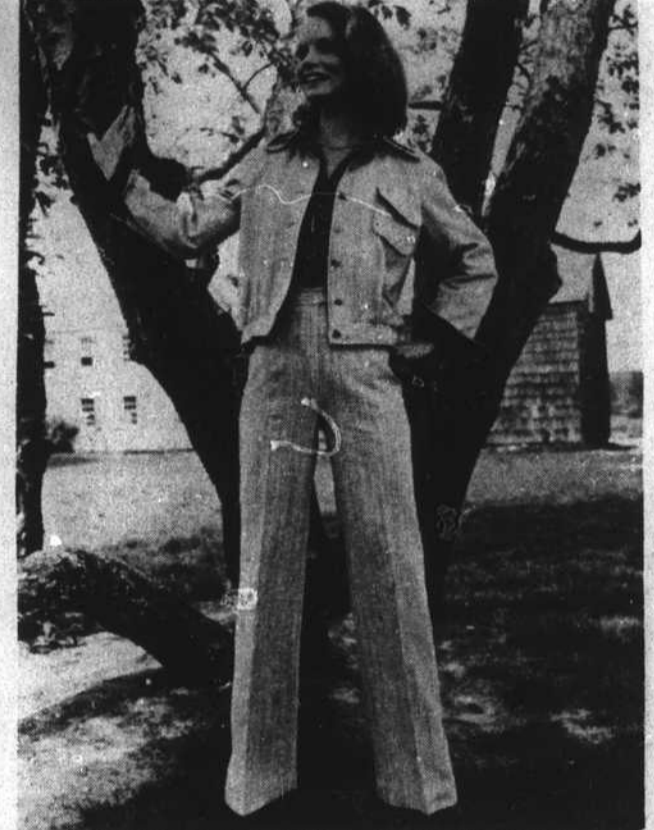
Betsy Koppen of her sorority, Kappa Alpha Theta.

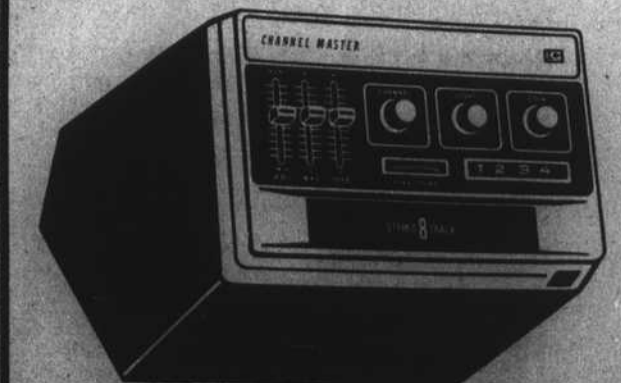
