County Will Run Landfill Operation

—Continued From Page One Hahn read a letter from Brevard Mayor Charles Campbell requesting the commissioners to give their half of Franklin Park to the city. The commissioners responded by offering to lease the land to the city for a term of 50 years. County Attorney Bill White explained that the county could not simply give away its property, but a lease arrangement will accomplish the same purpose.

One of the most time consuming items was the discussion surrounding the operation of the landfill at Calvert. The commissioners began by rejecting all bids from private contractors to operate the landfill.

Chairman Ives said that after careful study the commissioners felt quite certain that the county could operate the landfill at far less cost. With this motion out of the way, they then restudied the bids for a front end loader.

Ives asked White if they could accept a bid that did not meet the specifications. White asked for time to check the Statutes and a five minute recess was called, after which White reported that he felt the commissioners should not vary from the specifications.

After several more comments from representatives of the dealers, Chairman Ives moved that they accept the lowest bid which was submitted by Fiat Allis for its 7GB Loader at a price of \$41,298.
