**18-Year-Olds Reminded They Must Register**

"All young men who reach age 18 during 1975 should plan this year on making their first contact with Selective Service," John C. Cassell, Jr., Chairman of Transylvania County local board, announced today.

"Even though we are not currently drafting for military service," Mr. Cassell said, "registration with Selective Service is still compulsory for all young men at age 18, so each man should make certain that he complies with the law by registering."

Cassell stated that a young man has 60 days in which to register - 30 days before his 18th birthday and 30 days after. "This should provide adequate time for an 18-year-old or a near 18-year-old to register," Cassell added, "and his timely registration will prevent any problems that might otherwise result from a
