Science For You

PROBLEM: Does the snow blow away?

NEEDED: Observation of light snow in the wind.

COMMENT: When the wind is strong, the snow seems to blow away even though the temperature is below freezing and we know the snow cannot melt.

Snow is made of ice crystals, and ice is one of the substances that can pass from the solid to the gaseous state without going through the liquid state. This is called "sublimation."

So, we see that the snow sublimates when the weather is too cold for it to melt, and the wind blows it about. Large pieces of ice don't usually do this to a noticeable extent.
