pointed out, could enter off N. Broad, discharge the children, and then continue on to McLean, then back to N. Broad, if a stoplight were installed at N. Broad and McLean.

The cost of widening and paving the road, District Highway Engineer T. M. Austell estimated, would be \$15,000, with the stoplight and turn lane costing another \$15,000. But local governments would have to obtain the right of way, he added.

School Board Member Dr. Jerry Cabe said he would present the proposal for a traffic light at McLean to a meeting of the whole board Thursday night.

Still, information from the developers of the shopping center must be obtained, it was pointed out before a final

decision can be made.
If the builders can obtain a small right of way from Brevard College to place the entrance opposite Fisher Rd., then that would be the logical place for the stoplight, Mayor Campbell said. However if the development plans call for the entrance opposite McLean Rd., then that might be the best place for it.

Mr. Campbell, obviously favoring the Fisher Rd. site for the light, repeated: "We don't want to build a sidewalk which dead ends into a four lane highway with no stoplight."
