RALEIGH - On-farm inspection of North Carolina feeder and breeding swine within 90 days of sale will be dropped effective February 1, 1975. All other intra-state and interstate regulations will remain in effect.

According to N. C. Commissioner of Agriculture James A. Graham the swine movement requirement is being relaxed because there have no cases of hog cholera in the state in two years. North Carolina was certified hog cholera-free January 16, 1974.


Graham praised the work of teachers, the vo-ag Agricultural Extension Service, NCDA and USDA inspectors and the farmers for their joint cooperation in enforcing swine movement laws. "It is due to their efforts that hog cholera and other swine disorders are under control in North Carolina."




