Their daily out-put is, about a hundred thousand. The other, handles pine and poplar, sawing about fifty thousand feet per day. The company also runs a large, well ses a water mill owned and operated by Mr. Blount, one of the leading men of the place. To this mill is attached a dynamo that furnishes the town with electric lights. Roper caims a population of fifteen hundred. It has four neat houses of worship, two drug *stores, two doctors, and one resident minister, Rev. Mr. Davis, who has planted himself in the hearts of his people and is doing a noble work for the Master. The pay-roll of the John L. Roper Lumber Company numbers about Eight hundred, and the money turned loose in Roper on pay-day creates quite a flutter among the mercantile fraternity. 




