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BRAZIL PROCLAIMS TRYING TO WIN WAR WITH GERMANY WITH ONE BLOW

CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES AND SENATE DECREE THAT STATE OF WAR EXISTS.

IS SANCTIONED BY PRESIDENT

Senate Unanimously Approves Decree and Vote in Favor of Deputies is 149 to 1—Torpedo Boat Destroyers Get Orders.

Rio Janeiro—The chamber of deputies by an almost unanimous vote, declared that a state of war existed between Germany and Brazil...

The inference was filed to certify after a demand on the opportunity of the president of the diplomatic commission spoke in favor of a law worded as follows:

"A state of war between Brazil and Germany is hereby acknowledged and proclaimed. The president of the republic is authorized to adopt the measures enunciated in his message of the 25th of October...

The virtually unanimous vote of the deputies was received with general acclamation.

The senate unanimously approved the proclamation of a state of war with Germany.

President Bras has sanctioned the proclamation of a state of war with Germany.

According to the newspapers, torpedo boat destroyers have received orders to proceed to Bagin and take possession of the German gunboat Eber...

The Eber is a vessel of 324 tons. She is 295 feet long and has a draught of nine feet and eight inches.

Thousands of Italian soldiers are accepting certain death to stem the Austro-German rush long enough for Italy's reserve armies to come up and take over Tagliamento line.

The frank admission was made here tonight that there will be no effort to establish a line above the Tagliamento.

This will mean the abandonment of Udine and a retreat of approximately 20 more miles before the Italian army undertakes to hold a defined line.

In order to hold this front Italy is massing all the soldiers she can mobilize. The Adriatic littoral is being stripped of men.

The coast has been left to the navy. The Italian and Austrian navies are about equal in strength...
