#### A NEGRO COLONY

A committe representing \$00 ne groes of New York, Philadelphia Chicago, St. Louis, Cincinnati, Washngton and some southern cities who have organized the People's Civil League, is negotiating with the Santa Fe Railroad for the purchase of 20, 000 neres in Western Kansas, or which to establish a farming colony, which is to be exclusively negro. Only negroes now farming or those in cities who wish to farm will be admitted to the colony. The deeds to the fund will prevent in perpetuity, its resale to a white man and the charter of the colony will provide that only negroes shall hold office. Negro teachers will direct the aim of the young idea in the colony. Churches will be given ten acres apiece as sites out only one church of any denomination is to be admitted.
