Loss of Life or Damage Done the Liner.

## (By International News Service.)

London, Nov. 8 .- It was reported here today that the American Hawalin liner Columbia with a crew of Pabout one hundred Americans abourd was attacked and shelled by a submarine today somewhere off the Portuguese coast.

Wireless calls for aid were reported along the Portuguese and French It was said the submarine was the same that had been waylaying neutral vessels in the vicinity for the nest three weeks.

Columbia sailed from Yerk on October 28 under charter for Genes by French ports. No information was available as to the possible loss of life or the extent of the damage done the liner

Flew United States Flag New York, Nov. 8 .- The Columbia although owned by the American Hawlian Company was under charter to the France and Canada Company an American shipping concern.

It was positively stated that the carried no explosives. There were about 80 seamen and horse tenders on board all Americans. The ship flew the United States flag.
