SYNOPSIS OF PENDING SCHEME OF CURRENCY BILL AS TO STATES EAST OF THE MISSISSIPPI. Non-Interest Bearing \$100 Notes. Receivable for public dues before April 1st, 1864, at par; from and after April 1st, 1864, not receivable at all.

FUNDABLE IN FOUR PER CENT. BONDS. Before 1st April, 1864, at par.

From 1st to last day of April, inc., at 66 2/3. From 1st to last day of May, inc., at 56 2/3. From 1st to last day of June, inc., at 46 2/3. From 1st to last day of July, inc., at 36 2/3. From 1st to last day of Aug., inc., at 26 2/3. From 1st to last day of Sept., inc., at 16 2/3.

Swept away by monthly tax, Oct. inc., at 6 2/3.

Any non-interest bearing \$100 notes held on the first of January, 1865, are to be destroyed every 100 of value.
