Had we the means, how gladly would a large portion be contributed to the accomplishment of the noble ends so tenwomen of Virginia.

Ours has become indeed a "lost cause," and in duty to the pangs and fatal wounds of our own beloved land, we gave up every hope that we had cherished, and struggled to establish; and our honest and true lower. allegiance is due to the government to whose authority and power we have yielded.

But our dead are our own. Yes, our dead are our own. Their fortnnes and their lives were staked and lost in our defence, and "to resume from oblivion the memory" of those who died thus, is the least of the will be ended. task which we and our children and our children's children must labor to perform.
