Suburb of Haymount Taken In By 112 Majority.

Following is the result of Monday's election, under the act of the legislature providing for the extension of the corporate limits to take in so much of the suburb of Haymount as is described in the boundaries of said act:

Total vote cast, 300 For Extension, 206 Against Extension, 94 Majority for Extension, 112.
