To Overhaul Jail Plumbing.

A representative of the Carolina Plumbing and Heating Company, of Charlotte, has been here the past few days making plans and specifications for a new sewerage and heating system for the jail, and also for a steam heating plant for the county courthouse.

"Ploughing Up Roads."

Under this heading, the Tarboro Southern contains the following: "Persons will persist in running their plows into the roads when the rows run into the roads, and the work paid for by the taxpayers to keep them in repair is lost, with some such considerations have no weight. This vandalism to the roads has been perpetrated so much that Superintendent Martain has determined to invoke the law when admonition is unavailing. He had Dawson Grover, colored, before Squire Pender to-day for such an offense. He had warned him before, but a day or two later found the road plowed up again, and the side drain filled up. Squire Pender let the man go with the nominal fine of one cent. It being shown that the second offense was committed by his son, who had not heard of the warning and that the father had repaired the drainage before the sheriff arrested him."

Persons who traverse the roads in this county, report somewhat similar encroachments on thoroughfares. The attention of the county authorities is asked to the matter.

The Big Falcon Meeting.

The camp meeting, which has been in progress at Falcon, this county, for the past two weeks, has come to an end. It is said that the average attendance each day was two thousand, and that last Sunday there were between four and five thousand people present. They were delegates from six different States and Canada and Cuba in attendance.

Within the past year a large amount of money has been expended on the property of this camp at Falcon, and a large dormitory constructed, with 24 rooms and an attic, which will be used as a place for the students of this new theology, who attend school there. Offerings were made for the completion of this building at the recent meeting, and \$2,500 in cash was subscribed.

This meeting is attended by members of various denominations, but largely by Sanctificationists, and members of the "Unknown Tongues."

These meetings have been continued for 10 days, but hereafter it is contemplated to run them 20 days.
