### PENSIONS FOR CUMBERLAND VETERANS.

Increase This Year of Nearly Three Thousand Dollars.

The State pensions for Confederate soldiers for Cumberland county this year amounts to \$7,870.00, divided as follows:

Two 1st class at \$72 each... \$ 144.00  
Nine 2nd class at \$60 each... 540.00  
Seven 3rd class at \$48 each... 336.00  
One hundred and ninety 4th class at \$25 each... 4,750.00  
Eighty-four widows at \$25 each... 2,100.00

This is an increase of \$2,293.00 over last year. This does not include the county pensions, which it is estimated will produce about \$750.00 when cannot be distributed until early spring after the sheriff settles.

The warrants for State pensions will be ready for distribution on Saturday morning next (Dec. 14), and Major McKethan, the Clerk of the Court, will be glad if those entitled to warrants will apply at once for same.

The county pensions will be divided among those now on list, and therefore no need of new applications being filed.
