

Organized by Scotch of This Section.

The Scottish Society of America is a new corporation just chartered by the secretary of state.

The incorporators are A. D. McGill, John H. Currie, B. T. McBryde, A. A. MacKethan and J. A. MacKethan, of Fayetteville; Hamilton McMillan, of Red Springs; D. P. McEachern, of Red Springs; A. W. McLean, of Lumberton.

The purposes of the society as set forth in the act of incorporation are:

The undersigned persons, desiring to associate themselves into a corporation, not for pecuniary profit, pursuant to chapter twenty-one of the Revisal of nineteen hundred and five, laws of the State of North Carolina, do hereby certify as follows:

1. That the name by which this corporation shall be known in law is "The Scottish Society of America, Incorporated."

2. That the purposes for which it is formed are:

(a) To cultivate a knowledge of and preserve the history and traditions of the Scottish people in America, and especially of the Scottish settlements in the Cape Fear section of North Carolina;

(b) The promotion and cultivation of closer social intercourse between persons of Scottish descent in America;

(c) To rescue from oblivion the valuable remains of Scottish history in America;

(d) To encourage the immigration of Scotchmen from Scotland, to America, and generally to revive, foster and promote Scottish interests and sentiments by collecting and preserving records and traditions in any way relating to that people;

3. The said corporation shall have no capital stock.

4. The following persons shall be eligible to membership in said corporation:

(a) Natives of Scotland and their descendants;

(b) All American born persons of Scottish descent, either male or female; (c) Husbands of women, and wives of men, falling under any of the above descriptions.

5. The membership shall consist of patrona life members, ordinary members, and honorary members. The payment at one time of the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall constitute a patron, and they shall be exempt from further dues. Payment at one time of the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) shall constitute a life member, and life members shall be exempt from all further dues, and shall enjoy all the rights of membership. The ordinary member shall pay annually such sum as the by-laws may prescribe. Honorary members shall consist of such persons of Scottish descent as may be elected honorary members from time to time, and all of whom shall reside in foreign lands. Honorary members shall be exempt from all dues. Ladies who are eligible may become members by contributing one-half of the above-named dues applicable to each class of membership, respectively.

6. The affairs of the society shall be managed by an executive council of nine members, consisting of the president, the three vice-presidents, the secretary and treasurer, and four other members of the executive council shall constitute a quorum to do business. All business transacted by the executive council shall be reported to the next general meeting of the society, and at said meeting a majority of the members present may approve or disapprove any such action taken. The charter and first by-laws of the society shall be adopted by the executive council, but the said by-laws shall be subject to amendment or repeal by the society at any general meeting.

7. The officers of the society shall be the president, three vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, and an executive council of (9) members, including the president, the three vice-presidents and the secretary, who shall be ex-officio members of the executive council. The executive council may appoint such other subordinate officers as from time to time may be deemed necessary.

8. The principal office of the corporation shall be located, and its principal business is to be conducted, in the town of Red Springs, County of Robeson, State of North Carolina. But meetings of the society may be held at any other place, which may be held from time to time upon thirty days notice by the executive council as provided in the by-laws.

9. The members of the executive council, as herein provided, shall be ex-officio trustees of the corporation.

10. The following officers shall hold office until the next general meeting of the society in the year 1911:

A. D. McGill, President; John McSwen, Vice-President; D. P. McEachern, Vice-President; Dr. J. A. Hodges, Vice-President; B. T. McBryde, Sec. and Treasurer.

And the following member of the executive council: Hamilton McMillan, A. D. McGill, John Henry Currie, B. T. McBryde, A. W. McLean, R. F. MacRae, John McSwen, Dr. J. A. Hodges, D. P. McEachern.

11. Meetings of the executive council or trustees may be held at such time and place as may from time to time be determined by them, and ten days notice of such meeting shall be given, unless all the members of the council shall waive notice of such time and place, and fix a time and place for the meeting.

12. The corporation of all maintain an office in the city of Fayetteville, in the County of Cumberland, State of North Carolina, and the secretary and treasurer, or the president, shall be the agent in charge of such office,

upon whom process against said corporation may be served.
