WHAT THE YELLOW LABEL TELLS ON WEEKLY VISITS

The yellow label bearing your name on THE NEWS tells an interesting story. The printed label has its advantage in that it is a record sent the subscriber each week of the date to which his subscription is paid. If the date following the name of subscriber reads "June 20" it means that the subscription is paid until the first day of June, the year 1920. Number 18, 19, 20 and 21 indicate years and the month is given in each instance, subscription being paid until the date given on the label.

There is a possibility of errors in the list because the record when the present management purchased the plant was not exactly uniform, therefore if arrearage shows unfavorably in any case the subscriber is requested to adjust same as soon as convenient, because the list is being placed on a paid in advance basis.
