The Salary Bill

or before the first day of July, 1909 on the first floor of the court house in Henderson county for the Clerk of the Superior Court, Registrar of Deeds, Sheriff, Tax Collector, and Treasurer, Road Supervisor, Superintendent of Public Instruction and Board of Education, the Grand Jury and County Commissioners. No rooms in said court house shall be rented to private individuals, firms or corporations, for any purpose whatsoever; and the use of no room shall be given to any person, firm or corporation for any other than charitable or educational purposes.

That the County Commissioners of said county shall on the first day of June, 1909, and annually thereafter appoint three intelligent, well informed and competent persons, two of whom shall belong to the opposite party from the said commissioners, who shall be recommended by the County Chairman of the two political parties, as a private committee for said county whose duty it shall be to meet with the commissioners on the day or days set for final annual settlements, with the various county officers, and to assist in said settlements and see that same are properly made and proper and true records thereof be placed on proper books kept for that purpose. It shall be the further duty of the said finance committee and they shall have power to inspect the offices and books of all public officers of said county and they shall report the condition of all such offices and the books kept therein, to the County Commissioners. It shall be the further duty of the said committee to make and publish the annual financial statement.

An act to pay off and refund the indebtedness of the Town of Hendersonville:

That the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Hendersonville shall be, and are hereby authorized, from time to time and from year to year, and at such times as it may appear to them to be expedient, to levy and collect special tax upon the property and all subjects of taxation in said town in amounts sufficient to meet the bonded [in debt] interest, with the right to anticipate the maturity of the bonds by creating a sinking fund, under such regulations as they may, in their discretion, deem wise and proper and to the best interest of the citizenship of said town.

That if the said Board of Commissioners of the Town of Hendersonville shall deem it wise and expedient to postpone the payment of any of its bonded indebtedness, as its bonds may mature, then and in the event the said Board of Commissioners is and shall be authorized and empowered to refund the said indebtedness by the issuance and sale of new bonds in such denominations, for such time and on such conditions as the said Board of Commissioners may decide upon, making the interest on said refunding bonds to accrue annually or semi-annually and to pay such a rate of interest, not exceeding the legal rate, as the said Board of Commissioners may decide upon; the said refunding bonds to be issued under such rules and regulations as the said Commissioners may pass and determine for that purpose.

An act to provide the sidewalk in front of the Court House in the Town of Hendersonville:

That the Board of Commissioners of the county of Henderson shall be authorized, empowered and directed, to put down a cement sidewalk in front of the county court house on Main street in the Town of Hendersonville to correspond with the sidewalks already constructed in front of the property of private owners abutting on said street.

An Act to Provide of the Working, Making and Maintaining of the Public Roads and Bridges in Henderson County.

Section 1. That chapter three hundred and twenty-eight of the public laws of 1907 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. That the general road law as published in the Revised and as amended by the laws of 1907 shall be applicable to Henderson County except as hereinafter modified.

Section 3. There shall be no assessment of labor on the public roads in Henderson County, but instead, every male person between the ages of twenty-one and forty-five years shall annually pay a public road assessment

of \$2.00.

Sec. 4. That the making and repairing of public roads and bridges in Henderson County shall be under the supervision of one supervisor, to be known as the Supervisor of Public Roads of Henderson County, here after called Supervisor, who shall receive an annual salary of \$1,250.00, one-half of said salary to be paid out of the public road fund and one-half out of the bridge fund; that W. C. Jordan is hereby appointed as said, Supervisor for a term of four years from May 1, 1909. That at the general election in Nov. 1912 and bi-annually thereafter, the Supervisor shall be elected by popular vote as other county officers are elected.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of said Supervisor as soon as possible and practicable to make a complete survey and measurement of all public roads in Henderson County so that the boundary lines between said roads and abutting property may be easily ascertained when occasion requires. He shall lay off said roads into sections of from three miles to five miles, the township lines to be marked on the plat and observed in laying off said sections so that no section shall be part in two townships. Each section of road shall be named and numbered on said plat or map which shall be filed in the Supervisor's office and proper books shall be kept by him so that the exact data can be had for the use of the public. All public roads and bridges shall be made, worked and kept up under the supervision and direction of the Supervisor. The Supervisor shall, for the purpose of letting roads out to contract, make and file in his office detailed specifications as to each section, showing how the road shall be made and how worked and maintained. The Supervisor shall, in May of each year, after due notice to the public, let the work on said said sections out on contract to the lowest responsible bidders. Provided, the Supervisor may, when in his judgment the bids on any section or sections are too high, or when there are no bids, employ labor upon the best terms he can secure to keep up said section or sections. All contractors for sections of road under this act shall be paid one-third contract price every four months, but never until the Supervisor shall have personally inspected said sections of road and approving the same, and for this purpose the said Supervisor shall go over and inspect all public roads in the county each four months. No person shall contract to keep up two sections of road.

The work upon all bridges in the county shall be done by the contractor, when the public roads shall be let by sections to contract; the lumber and hardware material to be used in said bridges shall be furnished by the Supervisor and delivered by him to the points where needed. Provided, that the bridges across French Broad River, Mills River, Green River, Broad River at Bat Cave, Mud Creek, Hooper's Creek below Bud Maxwell's farm, Clear Creek below W. B. Coston's farm, and Big Willow below Doc Patterson's farm, shall not be built or kept up by said contractors, but shall be built, repaired and maintained by the Supervisor. When any contractor fails to keep in proper repair any section of public road according to plans and specifications and refuses to put same in proper condition after notice from the Supervisor, the Supervisor may employ labor and have same put in proper repair and deduct the cost of said work from the contract price agreed to be paid the contractor for keeping said section or sections of road in repair.

Sec. 7. For the purposes of this act all the public roads leading into the town of Hendersonville shall be until they strike the streets in the town which are, or may hereafter be macadamized or paved, regarded as public roads. Provided, the Supervisor and Town Commissioners may agree upon a sum not to exceed fifty dollars per mile for each mile of public road within the corporate limits of said town to

be paid to the town in lieu of letting said roads or streets in sections by contract as hereinbefore provided to be used by the town under a prorata mileage basis in keeping said roads or streets in repair.

Sec. 8. The uniform width of all roads in the county shall be sixteen feet except roads leading into Hendersonville for a distance of five miles from said town which may in the discretion of the Supervisor, as far as practicable, at all places, be twenty-five feet.

Sec. 12. The Supervisor shall keep in his office open to public inspection at all times complete books from which it can be readily ascertained what work is being done by him, what money is being paid out, to whom paid and for what purpose, and at the end of each fiscal year to wit on the 30th day of June, or as soon as possible thereafter, he shall publish a complete financial statement of the public road and bridge funds, showing the amount on hand and the itemized statement of the amounts paid out with the names of the parties to whom paid, keeping separate the road and bridge funds.

Sec. 15. The said Supervisor shall have control of the chain gang and shall have the right to organize or reorganize the present chain gang.

Sec. 16. That it shall be lawful for the State authorities to furnish the Henderson County chain gang with any number of prisoners committed to the State Prison that the said Supervisor may be able to use.

Sec. 18. That for the purpose making, repairing and maintaining the public roads in said county, the county commissioners shall annually, and at the time of levying other taxes, levy a public road tax of twenty cents on the one hundred (\$100.00) dollars worth of all taxable property within said county; and at the same time for the purpose of making, maintaining and repairing public bridges in said county they shall levy ten cents on the one hundred dollars worth of taxable property in said county. Provided that it shall be the duty of the said county commissioners to increase such levy after year 1909, from year to year, to an amount sufficient to build, repair and maintain, the public roads and bridges in said county as may be recommended by the Supervisor up to but not in excess of thirty cents on the one hundred dollars worth of property for public roads and fifteen cents on the one hundred dollars worth of property for public bridges.
