children, most of it would be saved, to say nothing of many lives, and the prevention of much suffering and sorrow.

All of these things, and more, are being taught in the campaign of education which is world wide today. But we are not directing our attention solely to the laity for it is also being directed to the medical profession. We are asking for higher educational requirements in order to be allowed to practice medicine in the United States. We have in it many of our medical colleges now, and in some of our states. But we haven't it in North Carolina as it should be. And we are asking our politicians to stop the cry of "poor boy and medical trust" when we ask for legislation that will keep out incompetent physicians, and there by save many useful lives to our state.

I believe I am conservative when I say that no less than 75 per cent of the physicians of North Carolina, and in fact, of the United States, do not recognize tuberculosis in its early and curable stage. The average physician is not a student of tuberculosis, and he knows little more about the disease than the average layman who reads the leading periodicals of the day. There are some who do not recognize the disease even in the advanced stage and others who fill out the death certificate to the effect that some other disease was the cause of death. There are still others who, while recognizing the disease, will not inform the patient to that effect allowing him to go in his ignorance spreading the disease where ever he may go. So, we are aiming at more competency in the medical profession by means of higher educational requirements for license to practice medicine, so that early diagnoses will be made; and we are preaching greater honesty on the part of some of our physicians, so that deception will not be practiced on patients, and the community have to suffer the direful consequences.

Philanthropy has been appealed to, and as it always does when the cause is worthy generously has money been contributed to the campaign for the prevention of tuberculosis. Hospitals and sanatoria have been built and endowed; competent medical men and women have been placed in charge of them. Dispensaries have been created and trained nurses employed. Sanatoriums have been established in many states, medical inspection of children is enforced. The United States government has been active to the passage of "Pure Food and Drug Act" and in the prosecution of the violators of the same. But there is yet much to do that has not yet been done. More recruits are needed for this great army of fighters, and more means with which to carry out the

work. The work has but just begun, but it is certainly going to be carried out to the end that tuberculosis will no longer be known.
