HOW BIRDS HELP FARMERS. Millions of Dollars Saved Every Year by Birds Acting as Insect Destroy. ers; Organize Bird Study Clubs.

There is everywhere a tendency in schools to instil into the hearts and minds of the boys and girls a love for the birds. Chie among the agencies which just now are promoting this beneficent work is the Audubon Society of North Carolina with headquarters in Raleigh. Recently this society has issued a beautiful little folder for distribution among the schools and individuals interested in the success-

ful prosecution of the work. The object of th's society is to protect the birds both song and insectivorous. and to acquaint the people, and most especially the farmers, with the fact that birds are the greatest insect destroyers in the world and not only with the old line south 15 east 40 poles insect destroyers but weed destroyers as well.

It is said that the corn crop of the United States is injured annually by destructive insects to the amount of \$100,000,000. It has been said and repeated so many tmes that some people find in the expression "swat the fly" something at which to laugh, taking it as a species of humor that is being of-

But this is not so, for the truth is that there is no saner piece of advice in the cause of freedom from disease and the holding of good health than this same "swat the fly" urging. It means more than merely knocking over a fly at a time, for the advice has behind it the call to the colors to continued battle against flies. And battle is demanded because they are the carriers of disease, the advance guards of

Right now the advice to "swat the fly" may be taken literally, for it is spring-time and with dexterous use the fly-swatter can do a lot of fly-extermination as the flies come out of their winter quarters ready to get to work. And each fly that is killed means so many flies less during the summer when there will be so many millions that the swatters will not be able to do the necessary execution. So, the thing to do is to fight against the increase in flies right onw.

But prevention is better than fly-

swatting. Filth is the breeding place for flies, and if you look out upon a place in which flies abounds you may well see in it a plant for fly propaga-Old tin cans with water in South 84 deg.
