NEW GERMAN CABINET IS UNACCEPTABLE

MEMBERS ARE SHOWING BUREAUCRATIC TENDENCIES.
Liberal Press is Outspoken in Their Disappointment.
(By Agency Radio to International News Service.)
Geneva, Aug. 7.—Profound dissatisfaction exists in German political circles over the new ministers. The expected progress towards a parliamentary government undeveloped is causing considerable unrest. The new cabinet members are showing a bureaucratic tendencies.
Official announcement was made yesterday that five ministers of state, including Foreign Secretary Zimmerman and four secretaries of state, including Finance Minister Lentze and Interior Minister von Loebell, had resigned their portfolios.
Dr. Richard von Kuehmann, the German ambassador to Turkey, has been appointed secretary for foreign affairs in succession to Dr. Zimmermann.
The liberal press of Germany is outspoken in its disappointment over the selections Chancellor Michaelis has made on his colleagues in the new imperial and Prussian ministers, which are held to show that the effect is one of names only and not of the system.

Government May Take Over All American Boats

Shipping Board Declares Demand for Cargo Space Urgent.
Washington, Aug. 7.—With the next ten days the government may take over all ships flying the American flag.
The Shipping Board declares the need of cargo space is so urgent that it cannot await the completion of the tonnage now building.

Owen, a well known family in the Etowah section of the county about ten miles from Hendersonville, was bitten one day last week by a dog which is said to have been mad. The head of the dog was sent to Raleigh and a telegram was received that the dog had rabies.
According to latest reports the little Owen boy is getting along nicely.

CHINA WILL GET INTO THE FRAY

President of the Republic Concurs With Cabinet.
Peking, Aug. 7.—President Feng Kwo-Chang has given his official consent to the decision of the Cabinet that China enter the war on the side of the Allies, it was announced today. Replies are being awaited from the provisional governments before any further decisive step is taken.

CAPTAIN L. M. DODAMEAD HERE ON A FURLOUGH.

Is Now Adjutant of the North Carolina Coast Artillery Headquarters in Greensboro.
Captain L. M. Dodamead, adjutant, North Carolina Coast Artillery is visiting his home in Hendersonville on a four day's leave of absence.
Captain Dodamead has a long military record, having been private and sergeant in the Governor's Guards of Columbia, S. C., during a membership of about seven years in that crack organization, from 1873 to 1880; from March 1900 to November 1903, private, corporal and quartermaster sergeant of company A 71st infantry, Virginia Volunteers; from June 9th 1905 to January 13th 1909 captain of company M, 1st Infantry North Carolina National Guard. Upon the organization of the Coast Artillery corps of North Carolina he was transferred from the infantry to the staff of the Coast artillery corps as adjutant in recognition of his exceptionally fine record in handling paper work. During the Mexican trouble in 1916 he was in the Federal service in charge of general recruiting offices at Murphy and Raleigh until muster out at Fort Oglethorpe, Ga., November 27th 1916. He was again mustered into the Federal service for the present war on July 31st at Greensboro, N. C., which is headquarters for his organization. While a member of the Governor's Guards of Columbia, S. C., from 1876 to 1876 inclusive, he was also a cadet at the Carolina Military Institute at Charlotte, N. C., where he was successively private, corporal, quartermaster, sergeant, 1st sergeant and cadet captain. Captain Dodamead has successfully passed all the examinations prescribed by the war department for Coast artillery officers, including fire and fort commander. The North Carolina Coast Artillery as it now stands consists of headquarters and six companies, totaling 680 officers and men; and a hospital detachment of one officer and nine enlisted men.

Coal and Coke Included in the General Embargo.

Washington Aug. 7.—President Wilson has extended the general embargo to cover coal and coke. This precaution is taken as there is danger of the American supplies leaking to Canada in such quantities as to increase the fuel shortage already acute.
