**RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE MARION DISTRICT CONFERENCE, OLD FORT, N. C., MARCH 14, 1922.**

Your Committee on Law-Enforcement and Resolutions submits the following:

Law-enforcement is one of the outstanding issues now confronting the people of North Carolina, especially as it relates to the anti-liquor laws. The question of "Wet or Dry has been settled and the issue now is obedience or disobedience, loyalty or disloyalty, law and order or anarchy. We believe that "Obedience to law's liberty" and that the Constitution upon which rests American liberty should not be ruthlessly trampled under foot. Therefore, resolved

First, that all Methodists in the bounds of the Marion District ought to discourage the buying

and using of intoxicating liquor as a beverage and thus reverence and obey the federal prohibition law.

Second, that the patriotic citizens ought to use their influence and their ballots in support of executive and judicial officers who are friends of law-enforcement.

Third, that this conference commends the increasing numbers of judges, solicitors, sheriffs and other peace officers who are faithfully enforcing the law and assures them of our co-operation in the discharge of their arduous task, as well as our support in the primaries.

Fourth, that this conference commends the faithful and efficient work of Mr. R. A. Kohloss, Federal Prohibition Director, of Salisbury, and the federal prohibition agents under him and urges our people to send to him evidence

and facts concerning liquor-making and liquor-selling.

Fifth, that we petition the members of the General Assembly who will be nominated in June and elected in November to enact a law-enforcement code empowering the Attorney-General to enforce the law throughout the state and to harmonize our state law with the Volstead Act.

Sixth, that we assure the officers of the Anti-Saloon League, state and national, of our abiding faith in the methods and work of the League and our support and co-operation.
