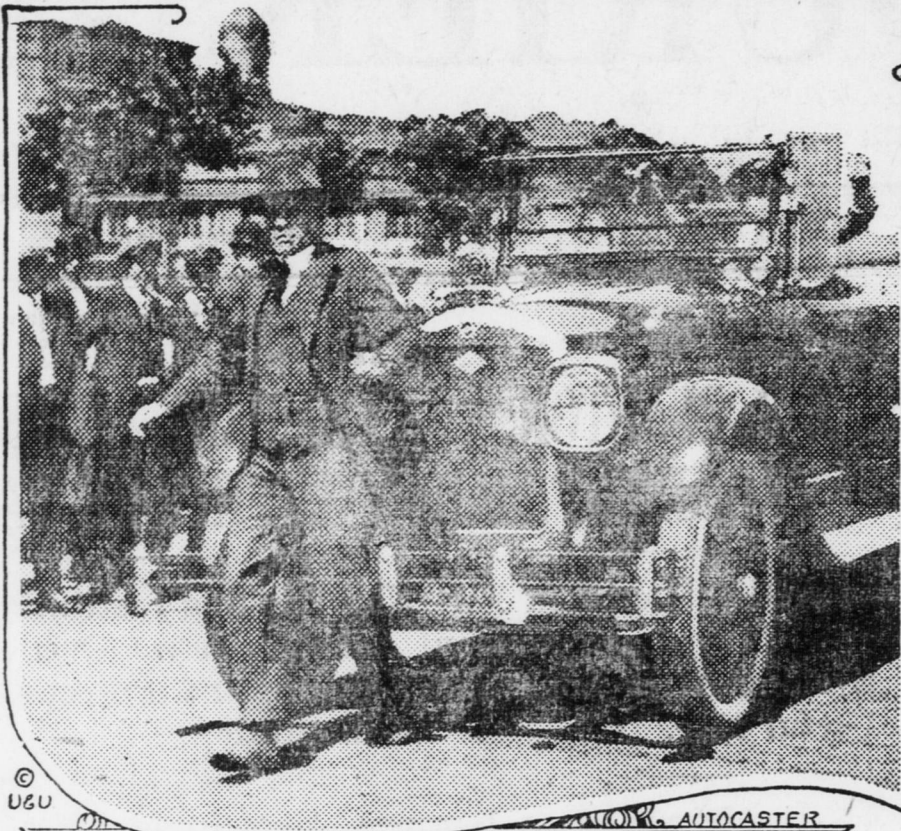


**This Auto Cannot Run You Down**

**RUTHERFORD TO AID FOREST WORK**

District Fire Warden Successful in Campaign for County Co-operation.

Prospects for active co-operation of the authorities of Rutherford county with the agents of the forestry division of the state geological and economic survey are reported to be highly favorable, by Clarence H. Burrage, district fire warden for eastern North Carolina, who returned last night from a trip of several days to Rutherfordton, says the Asheville Times.

Henry L. Forney and W. J. Harbin, fire wardens working in Rutherford county under auspices of the state forestry division, made reports to Mr. Burrage, showing excellent results in the work of forest fire prevention in that locality.

In addition to holding consultations with a number of the leading citizens of Rutherfordton, Mr. Burrage spoke to the county commissioners at their meeting Monday urging them to make appropriations for the extension of forest patrols in Rutherford county, in co-operation with the work of the state forestry division.

The county commissioners favored such action and indicated that a definite appropriation would soon be included in the county's budget for the maintenance of more fire wardens. One Rutherford lumberman offered to place a considerable sum annually at the disposal of the local forestry authorities, in order to obtain regular fire patrols over the region in which he owns timber lands.

Special interest was manifested in the work of forest protection by the farmers of Rutherford county, because of the great amount of sand and gravel washing down on the bottom lands. At the present rate, it was stated, much of the best agricultural property in the county would be made unfit for use within 25 years. Protection of forests on the mountain slopes, to prevent the washing down of sand and gravel, is the only way by which these valuable farm lands may be preserved.

**OPENS LAW OFFICE**

We call the attention of our readers to the professional card of Mr. Stover P. Dunagan which makes its initial appearance in this week's issue. **SPARTANBURG SECRETARY GOES TO SAVANNAH**

Spartanburg, S. C., July 10.—E. B. Walker secretary of the Spartanburg Chamber of Commerce for the past three years, has been elected secretary of the Savannah Board of Trade, and will leave for the Georgia city on or about August 10th to accept the position.

Under Secretary Walker's administration the Spartanburg Chamber of Commerce has been an extremely busy organization. Notice is hereby given that the Town of Forest City, will, at the office of the Mayor in the Town of Forest City, North Carolina, at 2 o'clock p. m., on

Tuesday, the 1st day of Aug., 1922, receive sealed bids or proposals for the purchase of \$50,000.00 Water Supply extension Bonds of the Town of Forest City, 1922 issue and \$15,000.00 Sewer Supply extension Bonds of the town of Forest City, N. C., 1922 issue. Said water supply extension bonds shall be of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, and said Sewer Supply Extension Bonds shall be of the denomination of \$500.00 each; all of said bonds will be dated July 1st, 1922, and will draw interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, interest payable semi-annually.

Said Water Supply extension bonds shall be numbered consecutively from 1 to 150 inclusive, and said Sewer Supply extension bonds shall be numbered consecutively from 1 to 30 inclusive, both of said issues shall be serial. The Water Supply extension bonds shall be payable in the following amounts and at the following times: \$1000.00 per year for the years 1927 to 1933 inclusive; \$2,000.00 per year for the years 1934 to 1947 inclusive, and \$3,000.00 per year for the years 1948 to 1952 inclusive;

And the Sewer Supply Extension Bonds shall be payable in the following amounts and at the following times: \$500.00 per year for the years 1928 to 1947 inclusive attached, and all of said bonds and the interest thereon will be made payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the National Bank of Commerce of the City of New York, N. Y.

Said bonds will be issued pursuant to certain ordinances duly passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Forest City against loss resulting from the failure of the bidder to comply on the following date, to-wit: May 23, 1922.

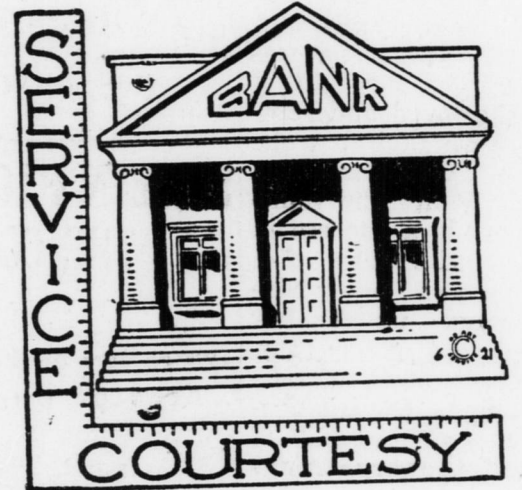
