INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

The Town of Forest City, N. C., will receive bids until 11 o'clock, the 19th day of September, 1922, at the office of the Mayor, Forest City, N. C., at which time all proposals will be publicly opened and read, for the furnishing of materials, labor, tools and equipment to complete such contracts as may be entered into for a complete water purification plant, extension to sewerage system, and water supply system, including pipe lines, special buildings, machinery, etc., all according to the plans and specifications prepared by The Carolina Engineering Company, of Wilmington, N. C., and now on file with the City Clerk at Forest City, N. C.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check to the amount of 5 per cent of the bid, not less than \$250.00, and made payable to the City Clerk without recourse. All bids must be on the blanks provided by the Board, copy of which is bound with these specifications, and placed in a sealed envelope, endorsed on the outside "Proposal for Improvements."

The Board prefers to let the entire work in one contract, but reserves the right to waive technicalities and let the entire work in parts to separate bidders for labor and materials, or to let such parts of the work as is considered to the best interest of the Board, and reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Contractors are cautioned to examine the plans and specifications thoroughly, form of contract, guarantee and conditions under which the work will be done before bidding.

TO IMPROVE ROAD FROM CHESNEE TO CLIFFSIDE

Gaffney Ledger: As a result of agitation on the part of the Spartanburg Chamber of Commerce, Charles H. Moorefield, state highway engineer, has written a letter to Dr. W. C. Hamrick, chairman of the Cherokee county highway commission, suggesting that the part of the Chesnee to Cliffside road in Cherokee county be improved by the local chaingang. Mr. Moorefield says the county's share of automobile license fees is insufficient to maintain the highway already constructed here. At present the chaingang is working under the supervision of the county board of commissioners, and the highway commission has no control of this feature of the situation, but it is possible that some plan may be devised whereby Mr. Moorefield's suggestion can be adopted.
