An act to prohibit and regulate the parking and placing of public cars and taxis on the streets of Forest City and to define a place therefor. The Mayor and Board of Com-

City do ordain:

Section 1-That on and after the 22nd day of November, 1926, it shall fer, public car, or taxi to be parked on the public square or any of principal streets of said town or in for the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers.

Section 2-That for the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers any such public transfer, bus, or taxi may park or come to a standstill for the purpose aforesaid for a period not longer than ten minutes.
