MR. JOHN GILBERT DEAD

Friends here learned with regret and shock of the sudden passing Monday of Mr. John Gilbert at his home in Avondale. Mr. Gilbert had been with the Haynes Mills at Avondale for several years and was held in high esteem. He was converted and joined the Baptist church there during the meetings held there during the past two weeks and was baptized Sunday night. He was stricken about 11:30 Monday morning and died at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon. He leaves a wife and several children.

BAPTIST CHURCH NOTES

Rev. Albert F. Mahan, D. D., pastor of the First Baptist church of Etawah, Tenn., arrived on Monday last week to preach in a series of revival meetings at the Baptist church. On Wednesday he received a message stating that one of his best members had died and after the service Wednesday night he went to Spartanburg, S. C., where he was entailed for home. The funeral was held Thursday afternoon and he went to Knoxville that night coming to Asheville Friday afternoon to find that his train was so late he had missed the train for Marion. He arrived here Saturday morning. During the absence of Dr. Mahan, the pastor, Rev. R. C. Smith did the preaching.

There were 452 in Sunday school last Sunday and we are hoping for a much larger number next Sunday. Dr. Mahan preached three times Sunday. He brought a great message at the morning hour and again Sunday afternoon at 3:30 and 7:30 Sunday evening. He has won the hearts of the people here and has been bringing wonderful gospel messages in a manner that commands interest. On Monday at noon hour a short service was held at the Mill and about two hundred hurried back from lunch to hear Dr. Mahan. This was a good number for the first day and the crowds will no doubt increase in number from day to day. Monday afternoon a service was held at the church at 2:30 with a good attendance. The largest crowd was Sunday evening. It was the largest number seen in the church for a long time.

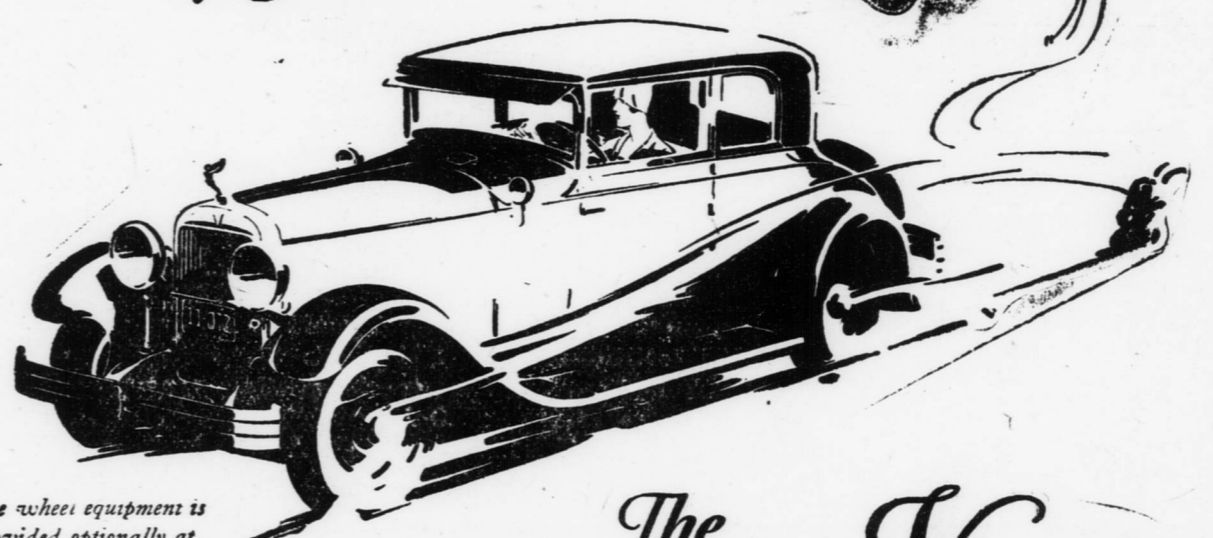

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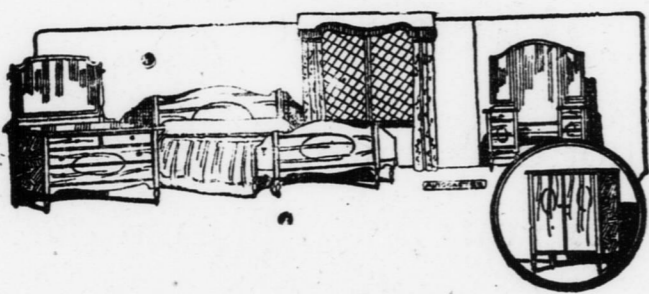
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
