

## GAFFNEY, S. C. TO SUPPLY GAS TO FIFTY CITIES

Rutherfordton and Spindale  
Are Among Cities of Pied-  
mont Carolinas to be  
Served

The Great Northern Utilities Co., with headquarters at Gaffney, S. C., will soon erect a huge gas supply station in Gaffney, and will lay pipe lines to all communities who sign the franchise within seventy-five miles of Gaffney.

Immediate construction is promised on the plant, which is to cost approximately \$4,000,000. The plant is to be the central station for sup-

plying the nearby cities. This huge project will mean the laying of gas pipe lines to a half hundred or more of communities in the Piedmont Carolinas within the next few months.

To date, thirty-six communities have signed up and twenty or more are about to sign. The cities already signed up are as follows:

North Carolina: Granite Falls, Rutherford College, Connelly Springs, Maiden, Cherryville, Huntersville, Rutherfordton, Spindale, Bessemer City, Kings Mountain, with Lincolnton having given approval which requires 30 days to become effective.

South Carolina: Landrum, Campobello, Chesnee, Clover, Blacksburg, Gaffney, York, Cowpens, Hickory Grove, Sharon, Duncan, Jonesville, Easley, Simpsonville, Woodruff, Union, Fort Lawn, Central, Westminster, Belton, Laurens, Toney Path, Newberry, Prosperity, Abbeville and Aiken.

The company agrees to lay the pipes and pay the expense of installing it in the homes and places of business. Farmers within reach of the gas lines may also obtain service. For cooking and heating gas is said to be more economical than electricity or coal.

## BOSTIC MAN GETS STAR ROUTE JOB

H. G. Harrill Will Take Over  
Mail Carrying July 1  
From Gaffney to Rutherfordton

Gaffney, S. C., June 11.—Postmaster F. B. Gaffney, of this place, announced Wednesday receipt of advice from the postoffice department at Washington to the effect that H. Glenn Harrill, of Bostic, N. C., had been awarded the contract for carrying the mail on the star route from Gaffney to Rutherfordton, beginning July 1. Mr. Harrill's bid was \$1,698.76 per year. He will be awarded the contract for four years.

Lee Philbeck, of Forest City, has held the contract for the past several months.

The schedule calls for the carrier to leave Gaffney at 5:30 a. m., and arrive at Rutherfordton at 8:45 a. m., daily, except Sundays. Returning, the carrier leaves Rutherfordton upon receipt of the mail from Asheville, but in any case not later than 9:30 a. m. a. m., and is due to arrive at Gaffney in three and one-fourth hours.

The star route serves the following towns: Cliffside, Henrietta, Avondale, Caroleen, Ellenboro, Bostic, Forest City, Spindale and Rutherfordton, all in North Carolina. The route is a little more than 40 miles long.

## AMENDMENT TO FIRE LIMIT ORDINANCE

Ordinance Amending Ordinance Fix-  
ing Fire Limits

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners and Mayor of the Town of Forest City:

Section 1. That section 43 of Chapter IX of the Ordinances of the town of Forest City be and it is hereby amended to extend the fire limits of said town as follows: Beginning where South Church street enters Main street, and running with Church street 200 feet; thence parallel with Main street to Young street; thence with Young street to Green street; thence with Green street to Depot street; thence with Depot street to Lowrance street; thence with Lowrance street to Broadway street; thence with Broadway street to Arlington street; thence with Arlington street to point where Beaver street enters Arlington street, thence northeasterly direction crossing East Main street on line between T. R. Padgett and the lot A. H. McDaniel sold the Methodist church, running to a point in line with Trade street; thence with line to Trade street and with Trade street to Cherry Mountain street; thence with Cherry Mountain street to Moody street; thence with Moody street to Yarboro street; thence with Yarboro street to point 200 feet north of West Main street; thence parallel with Main street to North Church street; thence with North Church




