TELEPHONE CONTROLS ALL TRAIN MOVEMENTS

Train dispatching on the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad is now done entirely by telephone. The New Haven was one of the first railroads in the United States to make exclusive use of the telephone for this purpose and to eliminate the telegraph and other forms of communication having to do with the direction and routing of trains. By the end of 1929, the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad plans to use no other form of wire communication than the telephone for any purpose, with the single exception of the telegraph printer which is used for general message service between divisional points.




