## THREE NEGROES ARE INJURED IN AUTO WRECK

Three negroes were injured, one seriously, when the car in which they were riding climbed a bank at Puzzle Creek Bridge, near here Sunday afternoon while attempting to pass another car.

The car, a Buick roadster, was coming north, and according to witnesses, four cars attempted to pass at the same time on the curve at the bridge. Three negroes, a man by the name of Perry and a woman and her daughter, Timbers, of Hamlet occupied the car. Seeing that they would crash if they continued in the road the negro piloted the car up the bank. It ran ten or fifteen feet up the cut and turned completely over, landing back in the road on its wheels. The elder Timber woman was seriously injured, and was removed to the Rutherford Hospital by Salvation Army workers, who passed. Little hope is entertained for her recovery. The others were also taken to the hospital, but will recover.
