Mr. C. M. Robertson, aged 78, died at his home here Saturday morning of heart trouble.

Mr. Robertson had an attack with his heart last June and had not been well since that time. He had another attack last Monday and rapidly grew worse until death came Saturday morning.

Mr. Robertson was perhaps one of the best known men in this county. He had served as deputy sheriff, county coroner and tax collector for the town of Forest City. 


