Big industries, such as the steel corporation, the farm implement manufacturers, and so forth, become unwieldly. They create great industrial centers in which living is expensive, labor costs become high, and discontent runs rampant through the ranks of the workers.

The small plant, located in the small community, where workers may have wholesome living conditions at reasonable costs, has many natural advantages. It can give its laborers more of the good things that life affords and still operate with lower labor costs. It can concentrate its sales efforts in a limited territory and greatly reduce, thereby, the costs of selling and merchandising. Its operations come more closly under the direction of capable management, while the great industry often operates inefficiently in many departments because of the scarcity of much needed executive ability.

All this is of significance to us here in Forest City. Small towns and rural districts have suffered in the past through the overdevelopment of great industries. They will natural ally prosper through the change to smaller unit industry in the future.
