Approximately 350 Students Took Part in Concert At High School Friday Evening.

Last Friday evening a large and an appreciative audience enjoyed the biggest and best program ever given by the public school music department of Cool Springs Township schools.

Under the inspiring leadership of Mrs. A. M. Glickman, our public school music supervisor, 335 boys and girls demonstrated in a beautiful way, some of their many accomplishments in music.
