o and fertilized with 200 pounds an cre of a 9-2-3 mixture. After the espedeza, the corn made 43.4 bushels of grain an acre and after tobac--o, made 25.3 bushels an acre. The increase of 18.1 bushels valued at ne dollar a bushel was due entirely o the crop of lespedeza turned under."


