



> Rutherfordton, Jan. 3 .- A total of 2,107 auto license plates were sold here from December 16 through December 31, according to Roy Hunter proprietor of the Hunter Automobile Co., distrbutor of license plates. Tuesday, was the big day, 442 plates being sold that day which netted the State Department of Revenue \$6,816.76. Over \$30,000 has been taken in here by the local bureau since December 16 and the tags are still being sold in large numbers.
