

STOCKHOLDERS ASSESSMENT ROLL FILED

Corporation Files List of Stockholders of Detunct Banks, and Amount of Assessment Against Each.

The six Rutherford county banks which closed on February 3-4, 1930, had a total of 301 stockholders who owned a total of \$475,000 of stock. The Farmers Bank had 153 stockholders who owned a total of \$250,000; the Rutherford County Bank & Trust Company had a total of 114 stockholders who owned a total of \$200,000 worth of stock, while the Chimney Rock Bank & Trust Company had 34 stockholders who owned a total of \$25,000. Between the time of the closing of the banks and the filing of the report, part of the assessments against the stockholders of all the banks was paid in. The assessment report, at the time of filing, showed a total amount of \$203,200 still due on the Farmers Bank stock; \$191,800 due on the Rutherford County Bank & Trust Co., and \$21,300 due on the Chimney Rock Trust Company stock.

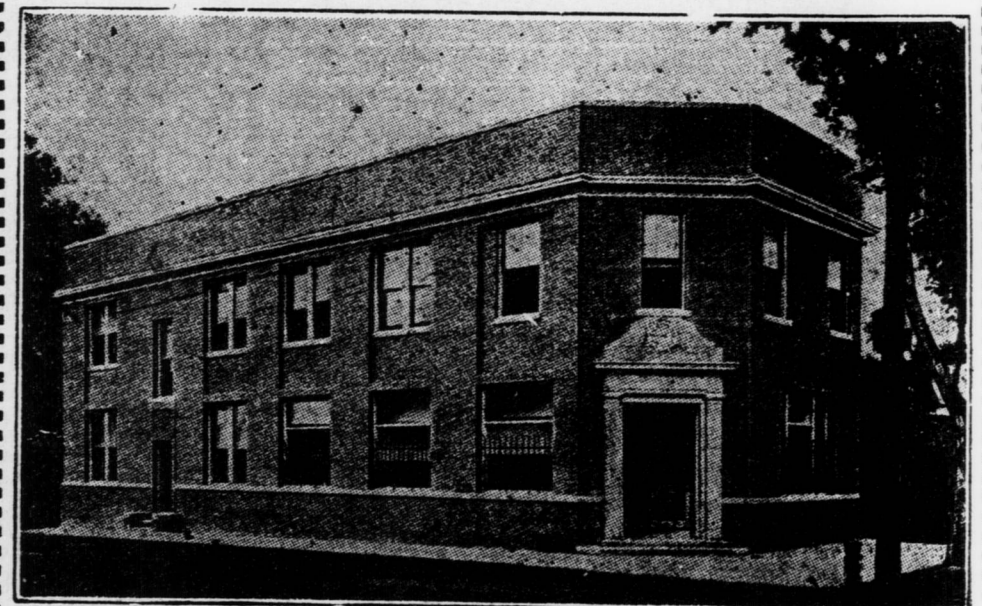

Tax Listing Must Be Done in April This Year and Hereafter

SPECIAL NOTICE is hereby given all persons owning property subject to taxation in Rutherford County to return to the tax lister of the township in which their property is located a full, complete and detailed statement of each and every piece and kind of property, real, personal and mixed, which said persons may own or control on the first day of April, 1930 together with as near as possible, the true value in money of all such property owned by them, or which may be under their control as agent, guardian, administrator or otherwise. Said return must be made to the tax listers on or after the first Monday of April but before the first Monday in May, 1930. The law requires a penalty of ten percent additional tax to be charged on all property not listed within the time and in the manner prescribed by law. All persons who own property and wilfully fail to list it within the time and in the manner prescribed by law are subject to indictment for a misdemeanor.

Females or non-residents of the township where the property is situated, and persons physically unable to attend and file a list of their property, may appoint agents to list their property for them. Such agent shall be required to qualify by stating under oath that he knows the extent and has knowledge of the true valuation of the property to be listed.

Please list your property before the tax listers and avoid the possibility of being indicted or penalized for failure to list.
