GRASS IS BEST FEED YET IS

Authority Advises Grain Feeding In Summer.

When Professor G. Bohstedt, of the University of Wisconsin, spoke that grass is the best, yet the most deceptive, of all livestock feeds.

Good grass is the nearest to a perfect feed that can be found, but short dry grass provides little nourishment, and especially lacking in protein content, Pro. fessor Bohstedt said.

He urged that all farmers watch their pastures closely during July and August, saying that the grass deteriorates in value very rapidly when it begins to dry up, and that the pastures are likely to be much shorter than the farmer suspects unless he keeps a close eye on them.

Professor Bohstedt is a close student of feeding problems and has conducted a number of experiments testing the value of grass at its different stages. He has determined, along with many other experimenters, that dry grass alone will not produce milk in large quantities unless the cow often resulting in permanent in-




