Mrs. George Tate Instantly Killed Thursday Noon by Mentally Deficient Husband.

Cliffside, Nov. 3 .- Mrs. George of West Virginia. Tate, aged 37, was instantly killed Thursday when she was shot twice with a pistol, by her husband. The shooting occurred when Tate met his wife on the bridge over Second Broad river, near the Cliffside Mills, while she was on her way to lunch after a morning's work in the mill, where she was employed. Upon meeting her Tate pulled out a pistol and shot her twice, death resulting instantly. A few minutes later he shot himself five times, and is now n the Rutherford hospital strug-gling for life.
