Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the Town of Forest City on the 5th day of May, 1931, for the purpose of electing a mayor and five aldermen for the Town of Forest City. The election shall be held from eight o'clock a. m., until sunset on the said 5th day of May, 1931. The polling place for said election shall be at the City Hall in the Town of Forest City. J. E. 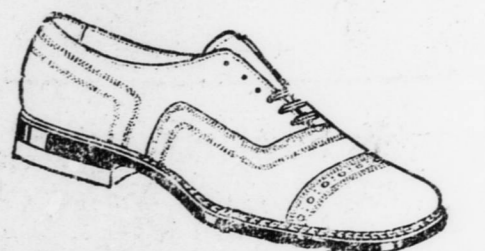
