

NUMBER OF CASES HEARD IN COURT DURING PAST WEEK

Proceedings of The Superior Court Through Saturday of Last Week—Bank Cases Settled.

Rutherford, May 18.—Mrs. Madison Lynch and John Paul Lynch, held for several months on charge of murdering the woman's husband, a well known farmer, yesterday had their freedom.

After a Grand Jury Wednesday forenoon had indicted Mrs. Lynch and her husband, the State took a farm hand at one time employed by Lynch, the State took a pros with leave in the case.

Lynch was slain January 25 at the door of his home. His wife said an unknown man called him from bed with a threat, "if you don't treat your family better, I will kill you," and shot him down with a pistol.

State vs. Kenneth Gurley. The court finds as a fact that the conditions of the sentence heretofore imposed as to the defendant having been breached the original sentence is ordered into effect, to run concurrently with sentence in following paragraph.

At the close of State's evidence the defendant enters a plea of guilty; judgment of the Court that the defendant be confined in the common jail of Rutherford county for a period of 90 days and assigned to work on the county roads and pay the cost, the time to be computed from the time of his original assignment.

State vs. E. B. Merke, defendant pleads guilty, judgment that defendant be confined in the county jail for a period of 6 months and assigned to work on the roads of said county; Defendant to pay costs and present bond to be effective until November term of court.
