**MOTOR TOUR TO PROMOTE CAPITOL PARKWAY ROUTE**

Committees Named to Promote Project — Caravan Will Make Tour Over Proposed Route on June 11.

Dr. L. B. Morse of Chimney Rock Wednesday appointed a committee who will be in charge of arousing interest in the proposed Capitol Parkway, a road leading from Washington, D. C., to the Great Smokey Mountains National Park.

Dr. Morse was named chairman of this committee as a recent meeting held at Rutherfordton.

Members of the committee as announced by Dr. Morse follows C. O. Kuester, W. T. Creighton, Bailey T. Groome, E. L. Baxter-Davidson, and William Nobel, all of Charlotte; Coleman W. Roberts, J. H. Monte, and E. H. Spence, Greensboro; A. G. Myers, S. N. Boyce, C. C. Armstrong, J. W. Atkings, and W. G. Gaston, Gastonia; Forest Eskridge and S. A. McMurry, Shelby; W. K. Mauney,

Kings Mountain; T. D. Bryson, Jr., Bryson City; A. M. Grist, York, S. C.; G. B. Howard, R. E. Price, and Dr. L. B. Morse, Rutherford county; Fred L. Weede and John D. Topping, Asheville; Oakley C. Mill, Canton; E. L. Withers, Waynesville; and Dan Tompkins, Sylva.

The committee met at the Chamber of Commerce in Charlotte at 4 o'clock Thursday afternoon when a permanent organization was formed.

It was decided at that time to make a tour June 11 through the towns along the proposed parkway.

**Tour June 11.**  
Representatives of Charlotte and neighboring cities on the capitol parkway will leave Thursday morning, June 11, to visit cities between Charlotte and Washington to bring a greater tourist traffic into this section.

Plans for this trip were made at a meeting at the Chamber of Commerce Thursday afternoon by citizens from Charlotte, Salisbury, Kings Mountain, Lake Lure, and other cities, Dr. L. B. Morse of Chimney Rock presided and presented plans for establishing the Capital Parkway route, which is planned to bring tourists from Washington, through Salisbury, Charlotte and other cities to the Kings Mountain National park and through Chimney Rock and Lake Lure into the Smokey Mountain National park.

Maps of the route are to be printed and distributed, and signs depicting the advantage of visiting the Kings Mountain and Smokey Mountain parks are to be placed at intervals of five miles along the route.

The trip to Washington and back will be made in three days, and short meetings will be held in the leading cities to explain the purpose of promoting the Capital Parkway.

Col. J. W. Harrelson, director of the state department of conservation and development, attended the meeting and announced that his department will soon issue several thousand maps showing places of interest to be visited in North Carolina. He also commented on the Southeastern Economic council as an organization that will be of great help in developing the tourist business in the seven southeastern states as well as in other activities of interest to the whole section.
