Proceedings of the Northampton Board First Monday in December—Bonds Approved.

The board of County Commissioners met in regular monthly session in the court house in Jackson on Monday, December 4th, with all the members present as follows: J. G. Stancell, chairman; J. H. Fitzhugh and J. T. Bolton, with S. J. Calvert, clerk.

Mr. J. M. Flythe, Superintendent of the Home of the Aged and Infirm, made his monthly report, showing balance due Superintendent \$8.29. He was allowed \$175.00 for use at the Home during the month of December.

Mr. J. S. Grant, Coroner, presented bill for \$51.65, expenses of inquest over the body of a colored man by the name of Bazemore killed on the Wilkins farm in Rich Square Township which was approved and ordered paid.

Mr. J. T. Flythe, Clerk Superior Court, presented one half fee bill for Fall Court which was approved and ordered paid.

Sallie Rook and Julia Parker were allowed help from the County Home to the usual amount.

The bonds of the County and Township officers were examined and approved.

Why Stars Twinkle.

The twinkling of the stars is chiefly an effect produced in the atmosphere upon the waves of light. It is due to currents and strata of air of different densities intermingling and floating past each other, through which the light passes to the eye. It is seen much more in cold than in warm weather and nearer the horizon more than overhead. The same effect may be seen by looking out of a window over a hot radiator or a candle held on the other side of a hot stove, so that you have to look through a body of heated air at the candle flame. The flame will be found to waver and quiver. In other words the various layers affairs are at different densities and in motion, hence the "twinkle."—Exchange.

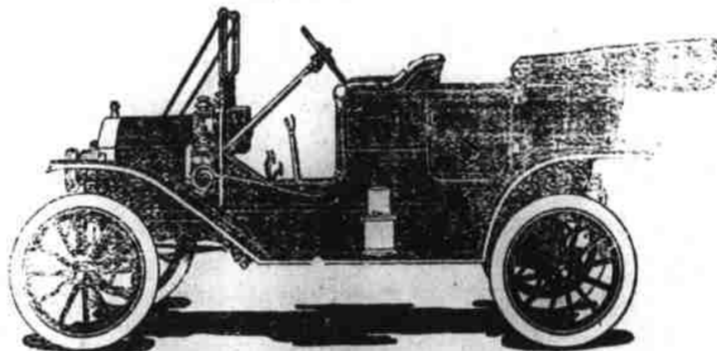
