

BRIGHT OUTLOOK FOR 1926

According to Secretary Hoover this country has a bright outlook for continued prosperity during 1926. Almost every line of business has had a good year, and if the public exercises caution against real estate and stock speculation which usually lead to inflation and then to heavy losses, there is no reason why a steady prosperity should not prevail. Continued demand for heavy construction is expected in view of the fact that many public buildings and improvements have been planned throughout the country. The textile and shoe industries are flourishing while automobile and tire industries report the greatest output in their history. In all the business world, perhaps agriculture has made the least gain during the past year, probably due to its inadequate marketing system. On the whole 1925 is not to be complained at and the prospect for 1926 looks even better. Secretary Hoover gives a brief summary of the outlook for the coming year as follows:

"The dominant favorable factor in our outlook is our increased productivity, due to fundamental and continuing forces—such as the culmination of education, the advancement of science, skill and elimination of waste. Other favorable indications on the immediate horizon are that the stocks of commodities are moderate; there is employment for practically everyone; wages are at a high level; savings are the largest in history and capital is therefore abundant; and the whole machinery of production and distribution is operating at a higher degree of efficiency than ever before"—Smithfield Herald.
