We understand one proposition is to incorporate only seventyfive or a hundred miles in the county system and leave the others for the townships to keep up, it being claimed that in a county system the roads serving the smaller communities would receive no attention, and for proof of this reference is being made to how they fared when all the roads of the county were under a county system prior to 1911.
