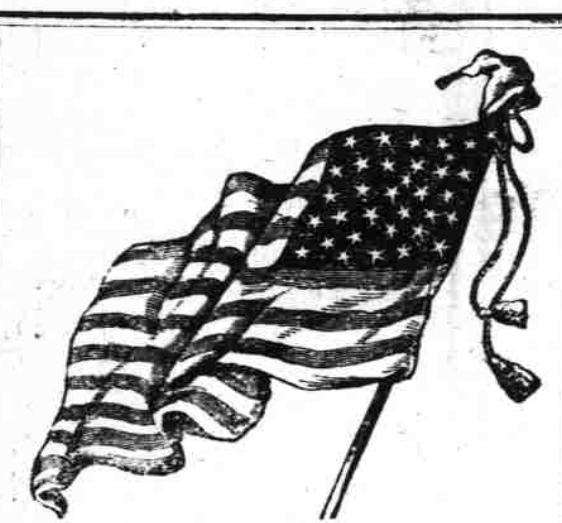

THE EXHIBITION GRAND.

The first annual exhibition of the Carteret County Oyster, Fish, Game and Produce Association opened on Wednesday December 14th.

The exhibition was delivered by Hon. C. R. Thomas Jr. Rev. E. H. Forbs, the venerable Rector of St Pauls P. E. Church offered up an impressive prayer. The exhibits were splendid. The attendance from abroad was slim, owing to the Rail Roads not keeping faith with us. We will place the blame where it belongs in our next issue. LIGHT HOUSE NEEDED.

Lieut. Winslow of the U. S. Navy, who is now superintending the coast survey and the survey of the oyster grounds of North Carolina says that a light house is badly needed at Gall Shoal in Pamlico Sound. There are two dangerous shoals at this point and there is no light nearer than fifty miles. His schooner the Seabreeze struck on one of these shoals a short time since and a necessity for a light at that point was very forcibly impressed upon him. Had he not been so fortunate as to have a well equipped crew, he would have sustained serious losses. For some reason or other the Department is not as considerate of the needs of Pamlico and Albemarle sounds as it should be. Most of the coastwise traffic of this section is done through these waters and the government ought to provide lights, beacons and buoys at every point where they are needed in order for the safety of passengers and the marine service. We hope this matter will be put in definite shape and referred to Congressmen Latham and Simmons, and that they may be able to induce the Department to do what is necessary for the safe navigation of these sounds.—New Bern Journal.
