P. O. & W. Rail Road.

The work on the P O & W R R is moving rapidly. The permanent survey is located to Reelsboro. 150 hands are cutting out right of way 100 feet wide, and have crossed deep run and are now on the sand hills within about two miles of Reelsboro, a grading force have reached the New Bern road, where it crosses at Barzella Holton near Olympia. The chief Engineer of construction was in Bayboro yesterday preparing to locate the line through Bayboro. Then he wants to begin work with more hands soon. He also wants to land a Barge of 500 tons of R. R. Iron and a small construction engine, so as to begin laying the track from this end so as to meet the other force at Grantsboro. They are using every possible means to have the road here by the time it was constructed for, and to this end they want all the laborers they can get. They want 2.50 to 3.00 more hands, for which they are paying \$1.00 to 1.25 per day, and 30 cents a piece for cross ties oak or pine delivered at any point along the right of way. Cross ties to be 8 feet long 7 inches thick and to show 6 inches heart on the face.

I further call your attention to Section 52 and 53 of Revenue Act of 1897, which reads as follows :

"SEC. 52. That it shall be and is here by made the duty of the Sheriff of each County in the State, to make a diligent inquiry and report to the Judge of each term of the Criminal Court held in the County following the time when the license tax and taxes provided for schedules A, B and C of this act should have been paid, as to whether or not such license taxes or other taxes have been paid by all persons or corporations liable for same, and to make out a list of all delinquents. And it shall be made the duty of the Judge to submit the list of the delinquents to the Solicitor to the end that such delinquents may be prosecuted for such defaultation in the manner provided in the next section of this act.

SEC. 53. That such persons or Corporations who are liable to pay the license tax or taxes provided for in schedules A, B and C of this Act and the Machinery Act, and shall fail to pay the same as provided by law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or imprisoned not exceeding six months and the Sheriff shall be allowed by the Judge such compensation for making such reports as he may deem just and proper, to be paid by the County."

ALSO SEC. 40. Every person who shall practice any trade or profession, or use any franchise taxed by the laws of North Carolina, without having first paid the tax and obtained a license as herein required, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall also forfeit and pay the State a penalty not to exceed twenty dollars, which penalty the Sheriff of the County in which it has occurred shall cause to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace of the County.
