Died.

On Monday morning November 21st 1904, Mr. Thomas Alcock at his home at Lowland, N. C. Mr. Alcock was born and reared in Hyde county until he was about 18 years of age. He then came to this county and has lived here at Hobucken and Lowland ever since. He won many friends here especially among the people that was near his age. About 13 years ago he married a Miss Sadler of Hyde county. He leaves her a widow with three children.

In August of this year a society "The Charitable Brotherhood" was organized at Hobucken and Mr. Alcock was one of its charter members. He was also the first one of the members to die, although the Society was so young in this county there was about 60 of the brothers to bury Mr. Alcock. He was buried very nicely indeed.

The 60 members of the Society marched 6 miles on foot from his home at Lowland to the Bennett burying ground at Hobucken where he was buried. The Pall Bearer was Messrs. G. O. Lupton, J. E. Sadler, Walter Bennett, E. Potter, Winfield McClerry and James Hodges.

Mr. Alcock was about 35 years old and leaves many relatives in Pamlico and Hyde counties to mourn their loss.
