White Jurors Acquits Negro.

Jackson, Miss., April 22nd.—For the first time in the history of Mississippi a negro charged with rape has been acquitted by a jury of white men.

Stewart Johnson, colored, was placed on trial yesterday morning. He was a penniless negro, twenty years old, and the court appointed Lawyer Watkins to defend him. Jake Turnbull, another negro, swore positively that he saw Johnson commit the rape, but the jury did not believe him. The woman could not identify her assailant, and an acquittal was the verdict at midnight. Judge Miller was awakened and went to the court house and heard the verdict and discharged the prisoner with the injunction to leave the town, which he did on the 1st train, and by daylight was fifty miles from Jackson.

Will our Northern Brethren who have had so much to say about the treatment that negroes receive in the South in the courts make a note of this and parade it as they generally do Lynching whenever it occurs in the South. This is but another proof positive that a negro can get justice in the courts in the South and always most generally does get justice and is treated better here than at the North.

Death of Harly Kugler.

Washington, N. C., April 21.—The news of the death in Philadelphia of Mr. Harly Kugler, formerly resident in this city, but at the time of his death engaged in the lumber business in the Pennsylvania city, where he was rapidly accumulating a fortune, aroused in our community profound regret. Mr. Kugler died of acute indigestion. His wife, whose maiden name was Miss Mamie Rich, and three children survive him. Her sister Mrs. E. W. Ayes, Mr. F. C. Kugler, a brother of the deceased, and Mrs. L. L. Knight, a sister, left here to attend the funeral in Philadelphia.

The many friends of Harly Kugler once a citizen of this county will regret to hear of his death, as we do, he was an intimate friend of ours and we regret to hear of his death, and extend our sympathies to his bereaved family.

Annual Meeting of The P. O. & W. R. R. CO.

The Annual Meeting of the P. O. & W. R. R. Company Stock Holders were present and out of the 7500 shares, 7200 were present and represented, considerable business was transacted, looking to the management and operation of the road as a general traffic line under the laws of the State, as the Sentinel was held over to get the proceedings. We find we have not space enough to publish them in full, the full proceeding will appear next week.

The Stockholders elected the following directors for next twelve months.

C. A. Flowers, J. F. Cowell, James R. Rice, C. M. Babbitt, W. R. Sawyer, D. B. Hooker, C. H. Fowler, James Spruill, S. H. Lane and W. T. Caho.

They adopted a code of Bylaws, Col. Jas. A. Bryan the Constructor reported he had crossed Deep Run and had but one other trestle to build before he reached Bayboro, that over Goose Creek, and the work on that was progressing satisfactorily, and if he was not interrupted by bad weather he could see no reason why he should not reach Bayboro by the 25th of May, that he was working men day and a night force on the trestle, the track laying will be in Reelsboro by the middle of next week, or May the 3rd, the report was received with applause.

After the Stockholders meeting adjourned the Directors met and reelected, W. T. Caho, President and Geo. T. Farnell, Secretary and Treasurer.

In accordance with the Bylaws adopted, the President appointed Jas. A. Bryan General Manager. The directors elected J. F. Cowell and Jas. R. Auditling Committee. The President appointed Geo. Dees, S. W. Ferebee and J. T. Cooper Proxy Committee. After the usual congratulations with the outlook of a sure enough rail road to Bayboro by June the 1st, to handle the present Truck and Potato crop, Amid great enthusiasm the meeting adjourned to meet on the 4th Thursday in April in 1906, unless sooner called together by the President. Full proceedings will appear in next week's Sentinel.
