#### M'ADOO APPEALS To union labor

RIGHTS OF HUMANITY SHOULD ALWAYS BE PLACED ABOVE RIGHTS OF PROPERTY

#### REPLIES TO TRADES COUNCIL

Labor Organizations Should Unitedly and Energetically Fight Against Re-Establishment of Reaction.

Nwe York.—A letter written by William G. McAdoo, in which he appeals to all labor organizations to exert themselves "energetically, intelligently and unitedly against the re-establishment of reaction in America," was made public here.

The latter under date of June 17, was in reply to a communication from John J. Munholland, secretary of the metal trades council of New York city and vicinity, which informed Mr. Mc-Adoo that more than 145,000 wage earners represented by the council recommend you as the most popular candidate for President that the Democratic party could possibly name."

After thanking Mr. Munholland for the "unsolicited and unexpected endorsement," the letter continues:

"The rights of humanity must be put above the rights of property, but the rights of each should be protected within its just limitations."
